




This course is part of the ACMT 2016 curriculum and is used to prepare for the Mac Service Certification Exam (MAC-16A).





Identifying Mac Models


Finding a Mac's serial number will aid you in identifying it. The serial number can be found by choosing About This Mac from the Apple Menu, or by locating the serial number on the surface of some products.



Serial number location on a MacBook Pro (Retina, 13-inch, Late 2012)









OS X




Machines Compatible with OS X El Capitan
