








OS X El Capitan: Time Machine

Why backup?



Without a backup, valuable information like music, movies, photos, contacts, and documents can be lost. With Time Machine, the entire contents of the system can be backed up, so that if anything ever happens to the computer or startup disk, the Mac can be restored exactly as it was at the time of the last backup.




